

Division III - Arrangements Rules

Arrangements Score Card (all classes)

Conformance - 15 points

- a. Naming of roses
- b. Conformance to type of design
- d. Other specific requirements of schedule

Design - 30 Points

Balance, dominance, contrast, rhythm, proportion, scale

Perfection of the Rose(s) - 30 points

Including condition of other plant material

Creativity and Expressiveness - 15 points

Distinction - 10 Points Unique, sets the design apart, superiority in every respect, includes technical execution/construction.

1. All roses must be outdoor garden grown and of high quality.
2. Roses must be the dominant flower in all arrangements.
3. Roses must be correctly named and listed on entry tag.
4. AG should be written on the entry tag if roses are arranger grown so the entry will be eligible for a medal certificate.
5. Only Miniature and Mini-Florals may be used in miniature designs.
6. One entry per exhibitor is allowed in each class, but an exhibitor may enter as many classes as desired.
7. Accessories and flowers other than roses and dried and/or treated dried plant material are allowed unless prohibited by the schedule.
8. A card of intent may be included with an arrangement as an explanation of the Arrangers interpretation of the theme or class title.
9. An arrangement incorrectly placed will be judged in the class in which it is placed.
10. All exhibits must be the work of the exhibitor.
11. No one but the exhibitor may touch or move an arrangement. However, in extreme circumstances, if all efforts to locate the arranger have failed, the arrangement chairman may carefully move an arrangement
12. The East County Rose Society or Ronald Reagan Community Center will not be responsible for exhibits. Your participation is welcomed and care for your arrangements will be provided to the best of the society's ability. It cannot, however, assume any responsibility for any loss or damage to property.
13. Reservations are required for all arrangements. Reservations will close Thursday, September 30. Please contact Frank Hastings 619-444-2552 or frankierose@cox.net for space reservations.
14. Arrangements must be in place and ready for judging by 9:45am on Saturday.
15. Some roses will be available at the show Saturday morning on a first-come, first-served basis.
16. Care should be exercised when preparing arrangements in the show area. ALL WATER AND TRASH IN YOUR AREA MUST BE CLEANED UP!
17. Trophies will be given out at 3:30pm on Saturday.
18. All arrangements must be left in place until 4:00 pm.

Disqualifications: 1. Roses not outdoor grown.

2. Use of artificial plant materials.

Penalty: 1. Painted or dyed fresh plant material or use of live creatures are not allowed. 2. Use of plant material on state conservation list not permitted 3. Use of any country flags are not permitted.

ARS Medal Certificates: The following classes are eligible to be considered for ARS medal certificates: Standard and Mini, traditional, Modern, Oriental Manner, Table, Duchess, Duke and Novice. Roses must be arranger grown and score 92 points or more. Dried Rose Arrangement classes & Judges Classes are not eligible.

Division III Arrangements

Section A - Challenge Classes

Dr Ron Hockwalt Perpetual Trophy - Modern Arrangement
Open to East County Rose Society members only.

Class 1 "ABC's of Roses"

Lila Mae Hastings Memorial Trophy - In honor of a Master Arranger. Open to exhibitors living in San Diego County. Perpetual and Keeper trophy.

Class 2 "Awesome Art"

To consist of 2 arrangements: 1 mini not to exceed 10-inches in height, width or depth and 1 standard. The 2 arrangements should either relate to or mirror each other. Arrangers choice of design, must be noted on entry tag.

Section B - Traditional Arrangements

Best in Section: ARS Royalty Award and Trophy

Class 3 "Ring Around the Rosie" (a mass)

Class 4 "The Teacher" (a line or line-mass)

Section C - Modern Arrangement - Type of design must be noted on entry tag.

Best in Section: ARS Artist's Award and Trophy

Class 5 "Classroom Aquarium" (Underwater)

Class 6 "Marvelous Music" (Modern)

Section D - Oriental Manner

Best in Section: ARS Oriental Award and Trophy

Class 7 "Prose and Poetry" (in a tall container)

Class 8 "Marbles" (in a low container-water must show)

Class 9 "Riding on the School Bus" (Free Style)

Section E - Duchess of Arrangement

Fresh roses with dried and/or treated plant material only. Type of design must be noted on entry tag.

Best in Section: Duchess of Arrangement Rosette & Trophy

Class 10 "Open House" (Arranger's Choice)

Section F - Duke of Arrangements Greater than 10", but not to exceed 20" in height, width, or depth. Arranger's choice of design. Type of design must be noted on entry tag. Best in Section: ARS Duke of Arr. Award & Trophy

Class 11 "Colored Crayons"

Section G - Novice Arrangement

Open to anyone who hasn't won a trophy in the Arrangement Section.

Best in Section: Trophy & Certificate

Class 12 "Zoo Field Trip" (Standard or Mini Arrangement)

Section H - Miniature Traditional

Best in Section: ARS Mini-Royalty Award and Trophy

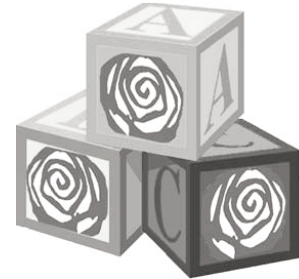
Class 13 "Line Leader" (Line or Line-mass) Greater than 5" not to exceed 7" in height, width or depth

Class 14 "Jump Rope" (Mass) No less than 7", not to exceed 10" in height, width or depth.

Not to exceed 5" in height, width or depth.

Class 16 "Backpack" (Free Form)
Greater than 5", but not to exceed 10" in height,
width or depth.

Section J - Miniature Oriental Manner

Best in Section: ARS Mini-Oriental Award & Trophy

Class 17 "Origami" (In a tall container)

Class 18 "Go Fish" (In a low container-water must show)

Section K - Dried Rose Arrangements

Using dried roses correctly named with dried and/or treated plant material. All natural material. No artificial plant material or accessories.

Best in Section: Keepsake or Mini-Keepsake Cert.. & Trophy

Class 19 "Sandbox Skills" Miniature Arrangement - Not to exceed 10" in height, width or depth.

Class 20 "Library Books" Standard Arrangement

Section L - Table Setting

Best in Section: Court of Etiquette or Mini Court of Etiquette Certificate and Trophy

Class 21 "Flowers for the Teacher" An informal functional-breakfast tray for one. No flatware is allowed.

Class 22 "Teacher's Pet" Using miniature roses. Semi-formal exhibition display using miniature roses.

Section M - Judges Arrangements - Arranger's choice (type of design must be noted on entry tag.)

Best in Section: Visiting Judges Certificate & Trophy

Class 23 "Reading, Writing & Arithmetic" (Standard Design)

Class 24 "Computer Lab" (Miniature Design) not to exceed 10" in height, width or depth.

Division I Show Rules

1. This show schedule has been prepared under the guidelines of the American Rose Society and will follow ARS rules and regulations. Judging will be in accordance with current Guidelines for Judging Roses. The judges decisions are final.
2. Classification of roses will be in accordance with the latest edition of *Modern Roses Official List of Approved Exhibition Names for Judges, Exhibitors Handbook for Selecting Roses, Combined Rose List*, or the New Rose Registration in the American Rose. All roses must be exhibited under the ARS Exhibition names as listed in bold type in the *ARS Handbook for Selecting Roses*. A rose variety need not be registered with the ARS to be exhibited in this show, but must be listed in ARS recognized publication. ARS publications take priority over *Combined Rose List*.
3. Each exhibitor must be registered and use an official ARS entry tag. Only ARS entry tags may be used. Complete ONLY the upper half of the tag including name and address. Use blue or black pen. (No felt tips please.)
4. The preparation area will be open at 6:00am and entries will close promptly at 9:45am.
5. To enter the ECRS challenge classes (A-1 thru 5), exhibitors must be current ECRS members of as of 9/1/10.
6. This is an alphabetically arranged show with each variety constituting a separate class.
7. Specimen roses must have been grown in the exhibitor's outdoor, private garden.
8. Wedging materials may be used with the exception of PLASTIC WRAP. If wedging materials protrude above the vase, the specimen will be penalized according to the degree of distraction.
9. Only one exhibitor or team from one garden may enter any one class. More than one entry of the same variety from the same garden in any one class will disqualify all such entries.
10. Containers will be furnished on a first-come, first-served basis by the ECRS except where otherwise specified.
11. The placement committee will place all roses except for challenge classes, Floating Bowl and Picture Frames. No unauthorized people are allowed in the show area.
12. Judges and members of their families may not enter roses except in classes 36-39.
13. ARS rules governing disqualification will be strictly adhered to, including misnamed, misplaced, misclassified, mislabeled or unlabeled, stem-on-stem (except old garden roses and shrubs), side buds, presence of a foreign substance, entries in violation of ARS or show rules, or without an approved exhibition name.
14. Neither Ronald Reagan Community Center or the ECRS will be liable for any loss or damage. All entries become the property of the society.
15. Trophies will be awarded Saturday at 3:30pm. Winners should be present to accept awards or make arrangements for someone else to pick up their trophies.

Division I - Horticulture

Section A - Challenge Classes

Classes 1-5 East County Members Only

- Class 1** **George Johnson Memorial Trophy** - A mixed bouquet of 9 - 12 stems of 3 or more varieties. Use any combination of roses in ONE container. Judging to be on overall mass effect. (Exhibitor to supply container.) *Perpetual Trophy & Award*
- Class 2** **Luis Desamero Trophy** - Stages of Bloom— Miniature specimens of the same cultivar showing 3 stages of development: 1 bud (petals unfurling), 1 bloom (approximately 1/2 open or at its most perfect phase of beauty), and one fully open bloom (stamens visible). Displayed in ONE container. *Perpetual Trophy & Award*
- Class 3** **East County Trophy** - A bouquet of 6-9 stems of modern shrubs exhibited in one container provided by society. *Perpetual Trophy & Award*
- Class 4** **Betty Dow - Lovely Lady Trophy** - 3 fully open roses of the same variety. *Perpetual Trophy & Award*
- Class 5** **Gerry Dow Trophy** - 3 stems of shrubs and/or old garden roses. Displayed in one container. *Perpetual Trophy & Award*

Open to all exhibitors

- Class 6** **Martha Epler Memorial Trophy** - Stages of Bloom—Hybrid Tea specimens of the same cultivar showing 3 stages of development: 1 bud (petals unfurling), 1 bloom (approximately 1/2 open or at its most perfect phase of beauty), and one fully open bloom (stamens visible). Displayed in ONE container. - *Perpetual Trophy & Award*
- Class 7** **Jean Kenneally Memorial Trophy - Look-a-Like Hi-Lo Class** - 1 H.T., G.F., FL, SH, or OGR. exhibition form for variety and 1 miniature or mini-flora shown in separate containers. Blooms to have similar form, color, and appearance. *Perpetual Trophy & Award*

Section B - Hybrid Teas and Grandifloras

- Class 8** **Hybrid Teas, Climbing Hybrid Teas, Grandifloras, Climbing Grandiflora**
1 bloom per stem. Exhibition Form. Eligible for:
Queen of Show - Award & Certificate
King of Show - Award & Certificate
Princess of Show - Award & Certificate
- Class 9** **3 Blooms - One Bloom per Stem**
Exhibition form of the same variety displayed in ONE container. *Award*
- Class 10** **6 Blooms - One Bloom per Stem**
Exhibition Form all the same variety displayed in ONE container. *Award*
- Class 11** **Floating Bowl**
1 Bloom. Exhibition Form. No foliage, no stem, container provided. *Award & Certificate*

- Class 12 English Box**
Any combination of varieties or all one variety. Exhibition form without foliage. (Sepals are permitted). *Award & Certificate*
- Class 13 Rose in a Picture Frame**
Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora - 1 or more blooms. Exhibition Form. Use of foliage is optional. Frame provided by ECRS. **1 entry per exhibitor.** *Award*
- Class 14 1 H.T. Spray or Cluster** *Award & Certificate*

Section C - Floribundas

- Class 15 1 bloom per stem** *Award & Certificate*
- Class 16 1 Spray** - *Award & Certificate*
- Class 17 3 Sprays,** *Award*

Section D - Mini and/or Minifloras

- Class 18 Miniflora** - One Bloom Per Stem. Exhibition Form. Eligible for:
Miniflora Queen - *Award & Certificate*
Miniflora King - *Award & Certificate*
Miniflora Princess - *Award & Certificate*
- Class 19 Miniatures** - One Bloom Per Stem. Exhibition Form. Eligible for:
Mini Queen - *Award & Certificate*
Mini King - *Award & Certificate*
Mini Princess - *Award & Certificate*
- Class 20 3 Blooms - 1 bloom per stem. Mini or Miniflora**
Exhibition form, one variety. Displayed in ONE container. *Award*
- Class 21 1 Spray Mini or Miniflora.** *Award & Certificate*
- Class 22 1 Low-Petaled Mini** (4-8 petals or listed as a single in ARS publication). *Award*
- Class 23 Fully Open Mini or Miniflora**
Stamens must be visible. No low-petaled. *Award*
- Class 24 Mini or Mini-Flora English Box**
Any combination of varieties or all one variety. Exhibition form without foliage. Sepals are permitted. *Award & Certificate*
- Class 25 Mini or Mini-Flora in a Picture Frame**
1 or more blooms. Exhibition Form. Use of foliage is optional. Frame provided by the ECRS. **1 entry per exhibitor.** *Award*
- Class 26 Artist's Palette**
An entry of 5 different varieties of mini or miniflora roses without foliage, arranged in an artistic display of color. **1 entry per exhibitor.** *Award*

Section E - Old Garden Roses

- Class 27 Genesis** - 1 bloom or spray of any type Old Garden rose, designated as "SP" in ARS Handbook for Selecting Roses. *Award & Certificate*
- Class 28 Dowager** - Any variety of rose except Species (SP) in existence prior to 1867, 1 bloom or spray. Date of Introduction must appear on tag. No Species. *Award & Certificate*
- Class 29 Victorian** - Any variety of rose in existence 1867 or after, 1 bloom or spray. No Species. *Award & Certificate*

Section F - Shrubs and Climbers

- Class 30 Modern Shrub - one bloom** 1 bloom with or without side buds. *Award & Certificate*
- Class 31 Modern Shrub - one spray** - 2 or more blooms with or without side buds. *Award & Certificate*
- Class 32 Classic Shrub Rose - One Bloom or Spray** - (Those roses with family designations such as HRg, HMsk, HKar, and Hmoy.) *Award & Certificate*
- Class 33 Climber.** One bloom or spray. LCL, HG or WHich. *Award & Certificate*

Section G - Miscellaneous

- Class 34 Most Fragrant**
1 stem. Judged 70% for fragrance and 30% for general excellence. *Award & Certificate*
- Class 35 Fully Opened**
1 bloom (except mini and miniflora) Stamens must be showing. *Award & Certificate*

Section H - Judge's Class

- Class 36 Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora** - 1 bloom
- Class 37 Floribunda or Polyantha** - 1 bloom
- Class 38 Old Garden Rose** - 1 bloom
- Class 39 Miniature or Mini-Flora** - 1 bloom or spray
- Award:** Best of Section Award and Certificate

Section I - Novice Class

- Class 40 1 bloom per stem Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora.**
Exhibition Form. *Award*
- Class 41 1 bloom per stem Mini-Flora or Miniature.**
Exhibition Form. *Award*

Division II Rose Photography

- Exhibits must be either 5x7" or 8x10", color or black and white print. Outside dimensions must be 11x14".
 - Print must be mounted and matted but not framed. If photo is unmounted or unmounted, it will be for display only.
 - Exhibitors are limited to two (2) entries per class and must have been taken by the photographer. Previous winning photographs in any ARS contest may not be entered in this show. Photos are to be entered under ARS Approved Exhibition Names.
 - Photos may only be entered in 1 class only. No duplicate photos.
 - Each entry should have an ARS entry tag attached to the top of the matting with a paperclip.
 - All exhibits must be picked up at the conclusion of the show.
- Class 1 Rose Portrait.** Entries to show the rose as a whole or near whole entity. *Award*
- Class 2 Rose Close-up.** Entries to focus on certain details of the rose (stamens, thorns, etc.) *Award*
- Class 3 Rose Art** - Entries evoke a new and different way of imagining the rose. *Award*
- Class 4 People or Animals in the Rose Garden - Entries to show a rose garden with people or animals.** *Award*
- Class 5 A Rose Garden.** Entries to show rose garden landscape. Roses should be dominate. *Award*
